

RULES: It is up to the decision of the tournament Director and the tournament officials shall be final in all matters .It is at the Directors discretion to make a change where safety is a concern.

ELIGIBILITY: One member of the team must be a Firefighter or a retired Firefighter.

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES AND DRUGS: During tournament hours no alcoholic beverages or narcotic drugs may be consumed or allowed in the boat except prescription medications.

BOATS&MOTORS: All boats must meet US Coast Guard and state regulations. All boats must have a emergency kill switch. All boats must have live wells.

TACKLE AND EQUIPMENT: Only artificial baits and lures can be used. No trolling. All bass must be caught on a rod and reel from the contestants boat.

SCORING FISH: Each team may weigh in four fish. Length will be 14 inches or greater fish will be measured on a flat board. Any team bringing more than four fish to the scales will be disqualified. If you have a fish less than 14 inches a one pound penalty will be imposed. No penalty for dead fish however it is each teams responsibility to keep all fish heathy for release .Dead fish will be weighed at the discretion of the tournament director. Only largemouth, Kentucky, Smallmouth and red eye bass will be scored.

SAFETY: A U.S. Coast Guard approved life vest must be on and fastened at all times when the boat is on plane and the kill switch must be attached to the driver.

PERMITTED FISHING AND LOCATION: No fishing permitted within 50 feet of another contestants boat. No fishing from a dock contestants must stay in the boat.

TAKE OFF AND WEIGH IN: You may put in at the ramp of your choice. You must stay within a 100 yards of the ramp you put in at until 6.00 AM then you can go. You can fish until 3.00 PM you have until 4.00 PM to be checked in or you will not weigh your fish. Weigh in will be at Bernice Point Resort. There will be food and drinks at weigh in.
